## RCIA Group

From year to year our RCIA groups consist primary of our catechumens, candidates and uncatechized adults. The Catechumens are women and men who have not yet been baptized, but have found Christ's presence among us and so choose to be fully initiated into the Catholic faith tradition at Easter, through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The Candidates are men and women who have been baptized in another Christian tradition, and now choose to celebrate their faith within the Catholic Church. The RCIA group also journeys with uncatechized adults who were baptized Catholic as infants and did not receive religious instruction or receive the other sacraments of initiation. We will welcome them into full communion, when they make a profession of faith and receive the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. This year some of the RCIA group will receive the sacraments, while others may continue another year of preparation and discernment.

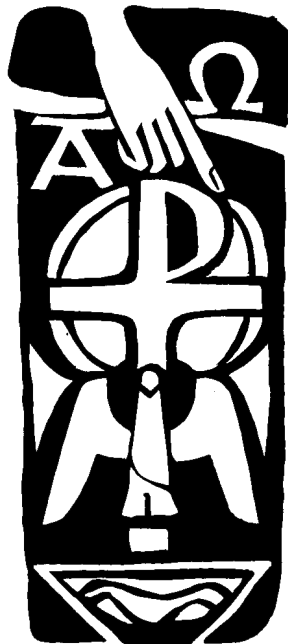

## The Rite of Sending at the February 14, 1PM Mass

On the first weekend of Lent, across the entire world, Catholic bishops will welcome the candidates and catechumens who have been sent by their parishes to gather, together with their godparents and sponsors, in what is known as the Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion. The Rite of Sending offers the St. Louise community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress that our catechumens and candidates have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to our bishop with assurance of the parish's care and support. To send a catechumen or candidate to the bishop means that the parish has discerned that the person is ready to enter the Catholic Church.

In Sacred Scripture, the Book of Revelation makes reference to a "Book of Life," in which are written the names of those who have chosen to follow the Lord Jesus and be baptized. The Candidates, who have already been baptized as Catholics or in other Christian denominations, had their names written in the Book of Life at their Baptism. In the Rite of Election, those preparing for Baptism (the catechumens) are invited to come forward and sign a book, which we call the "Book of the Elect," as a sign of their desire to be numbered among the chosen of God.
